West Auckland Parish Council is celebrating its 21st year and has recently completed an uncontested election and it's full committee of 12 members continue to work voluntarily to improve the village wherever possible. The Parish Council have always worked closely with the police, Durham County Council and other organisations for the benefit of the area. There has recently been an increase in anti-social behaviour (ASB) from a couple of small groups of youths; they have caused damage and been abusive to residents in various areas throughout the village. Unfortunately, the majority of good kids in the village are sadly becoming tarred with the same brush.

The Parish Council continue to work with police and encourage residents to report unacceptable behaviour to keep the area somewhere pleasant and friendly to live. A recently arranged Police & Community Together (PACT) meeting was well attended and informative. The next PACT meeting is arranged for Wednesday, 18th June 2025, 6.00 pm at Monteith Close Community Parish Room; all residents are welcome to attend and any information reported to the police or Parish Council is treat as strictly confidential.

As few words from local policeman, Scott....

As your local neighbourhood officer my role is very varied at tackling and managing a whole array of issues in West Auckland, one of these is Anti-Social Behaviour in the year I have been the neighbourhood officer for West Auckland I have seen a variety of levels of ASB. You may have noticed recently new signs appearing on lampposts in the village these are called Section 59 notices this notifies that the police can and will seize vehicles used in an ASB setting even if they are insured and taxed etc. As the neighbourhood team grows with the addition of new Constables and PCSO's I am committed to further patrols and problem-solving work in the community also involving other agencies such as the Durham County Council Neighbourhood wardens whose role is also to deal with ASB.

West Auckland is a lovely village with a good community spirit and as your local officer all I ask is that you work with me to tackle the issues in the community and contact me with our issues, concerns, and information to assist me in carrying out my role.

- Once again, the Village in Bloom volunteers have created a beautiful display of flowers throughout the village. They also help to keep the village in a clean state thanks to their regular litter picks.
- Thanks to Cllr Neil Simpson who regularly volunteers to support the Village in Bloom team and maintains various grass vergers around the village.
